From Mt. San Antonio College (Mt. SAC)

General Information

The minimum requirements for transfer admission are 26 semester hours with a cumulative 2.00 gpa. Certain colleges and programs have higher eligibility guidelines. Students with fewer than 26 hours are considered transferring freshmen and must submit high school transcripts and ACT or SAT scores and meet freshman admission requirements as well.
