

Laguna Pueblo Community Report, 2005

Demographics

In 2005, there were 2,840 licensed drivers in the Laguna Pueblo. Of these, there were 1,484 females and 1,356 males. The total number of crashes in 2005 was 116, yielding a crash rate of 41 per thousand licensed drivers (total number of crashes 116 divided by total number of licensed drivers 2,840 times 1,000). The corresponding rate for the state was 37 per thousand licensed drivers.

General Crash Information

Since 2001 the number of crashes has shown an upward trend. Fatal and injury crashes have shown no consistent pattern since 1996. Belt usage (as a percentage) has decreased from last year, while belt usage in crashes involving visible and incapacitating injuries has also decreased.

Alcohol-related Crash Information

Information about alcohol-involved crashes is included in all sections of this report. There were no people reported convicted of DWI in Laguna Pueblo.

Crash Specifics

Crashes involving other vehicles were the most common class, accounting for 49 percent of all crashes. Crashes involving overturns were the most common crash class which resulted in fatalities. Passenger cars were the vehicle type most often involved in crashes, accounting for 39 percent of all vehicles in crashes. Semis accounted for 23 percent of vehicles involved in crashes. Together these two vehicle types comprised 63 percent of the vehicles involved in injury crashes. The three most common top contributing factors were driver inattention, excessive speed, and mechanical defect. There were five fatal crashes in 2005. The most common top contributing factor for the fatal crashes was alcohol involvement.

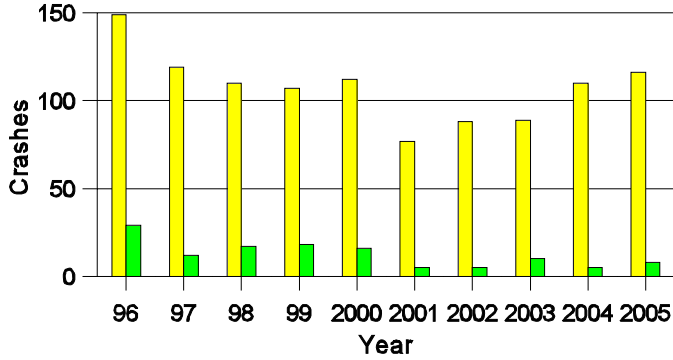
People in Crashes

Overall, males were 73 percent of drivers in crashes, although they account for only 48 percent of licensed drivers in Laguna Pueblo. There were no pedestrians involved in crashes. In 2005, no 'teenagers' and one young adult were killed in crashes in Laguna Pueblo. Statewide 17 percent of alcohol-involved drivers were under 21; in Laguna Pueblo none were under 21.

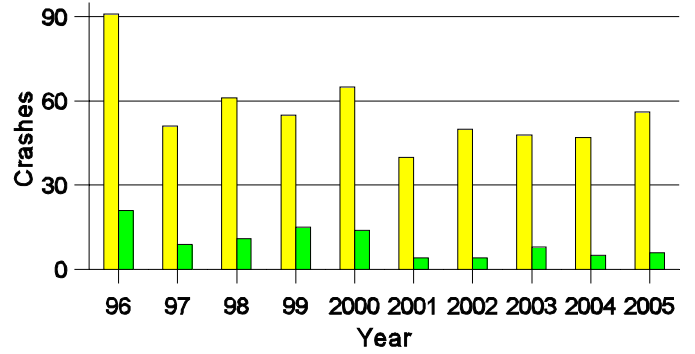
Note: The 1999 crash file contains 15% fewer crashes than the 1998 file. This may be due to problems implementing the new system after the old system failed, or to under reporting. Care should be used in interpreting differences between 1999 and other years in this report.

- Location of arrest/conviction was determined by police agency/court location, not driver residence.
- Crashes and drivers were counted by the city of occurrence/residence.
- Young adults are people between the ages of 20 and 24.
- 'Teenagers' are people between the ages of 15 and 19.
- Tables only include variable values for which there are data.

Fatal and Injury Crashes in Laguna Pueblo by Alcohol Involvement

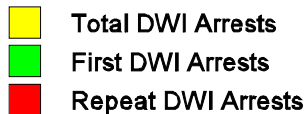
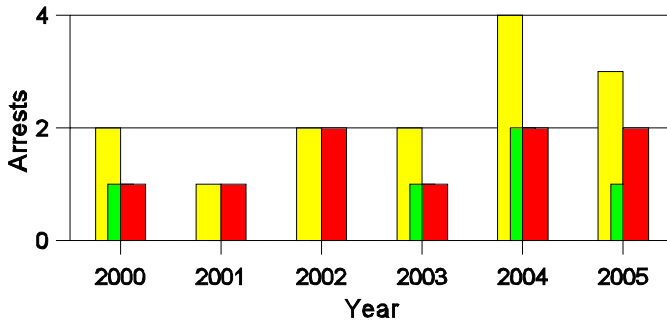


Passenger Vehicle Seatbelt Usage and Injuries in Laguna, 2003-2005

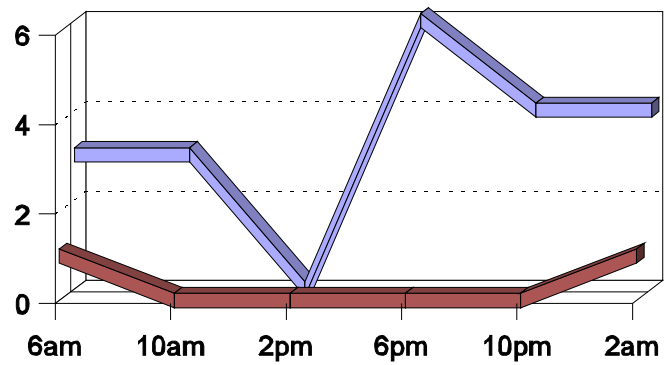

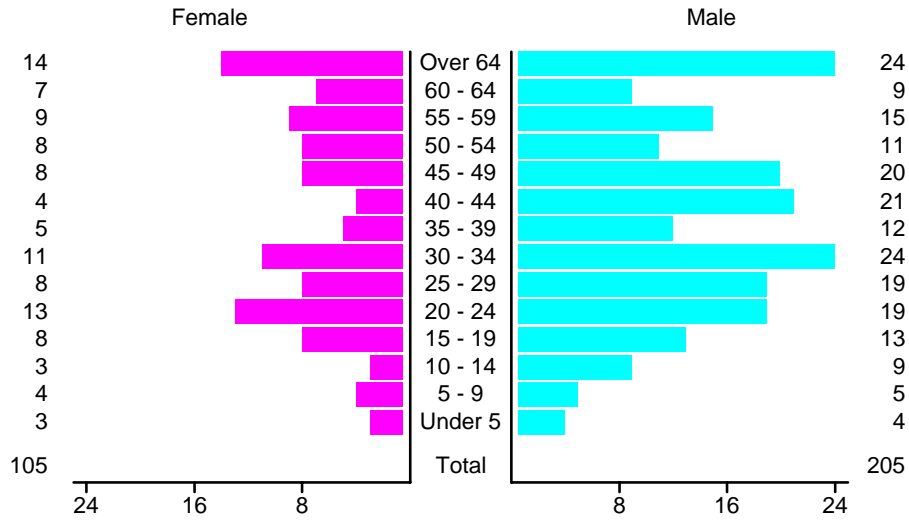

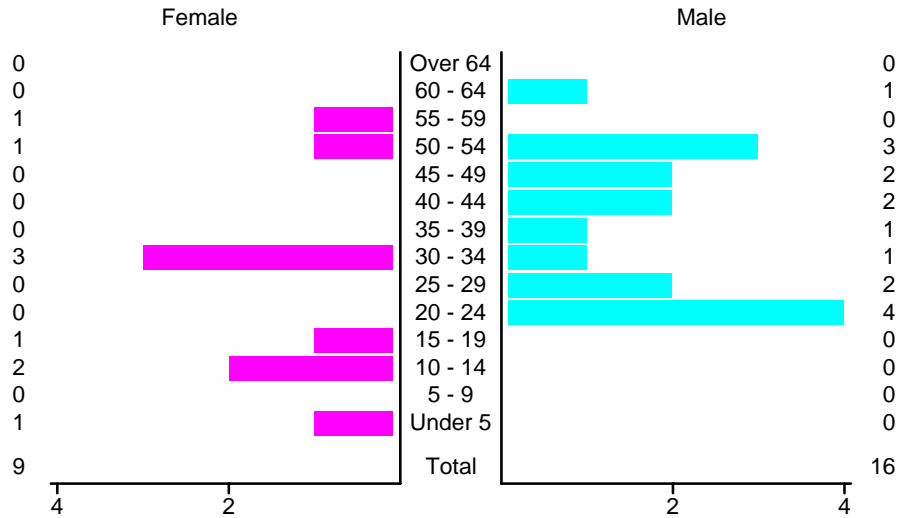

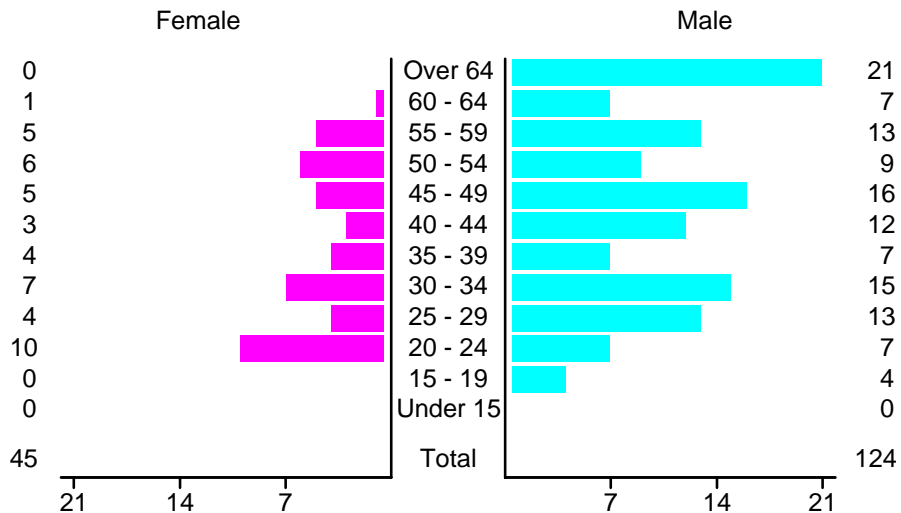
People in Crashes in Laguna Pueblo, 2005 by Age and Sex



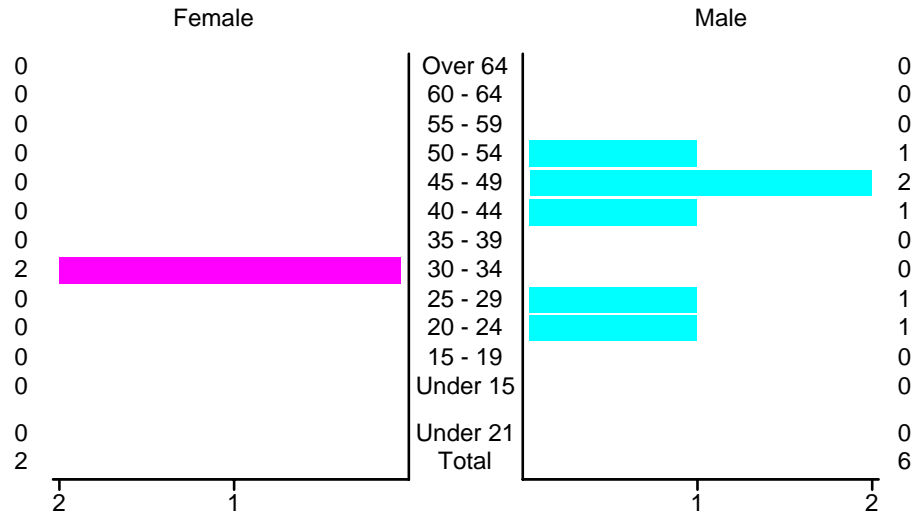
People in Alcohol-Involved Crashes in Laguna Pueblo, 2005 by Age and Sex



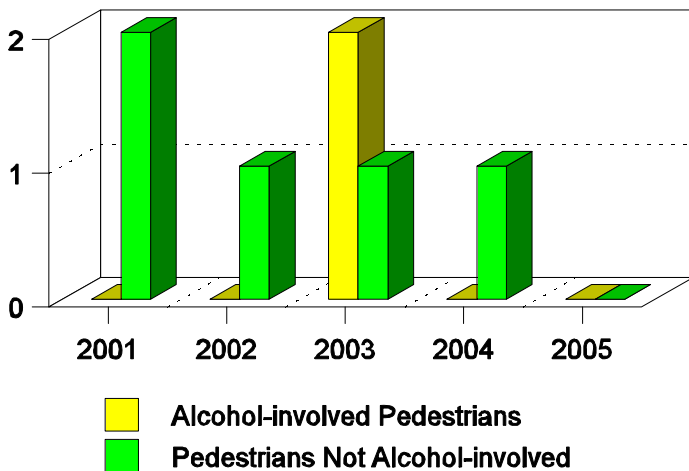
Drivers in Crashes by Age and Sex in Laguna Pueblo, 2005



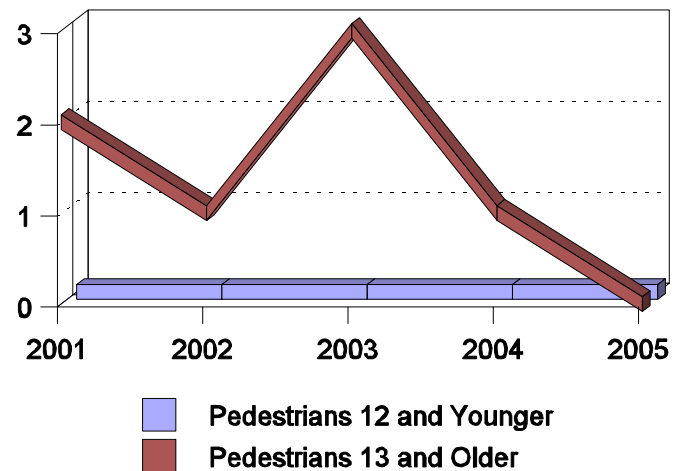
**Alcohol-Involved Drivers in Crashes in Laguna Pueblo, 2005
