

Acoma Pueblo Community Report, 2006

Demographics

In 2006, there were 1,118 licensed drivers in Acoma Pueblo. Of these, there were 602 females and 516 males. The total number of crashes in 2006 was 33, yielding a crash rate of 30 per thousand licensed drivers (Total number of crashes 33 divided by total licensed drivers 1,118 times 1,000). The corresponding rate for the state was 36 per thousand licensed drivers.

General Crash Information

Since 1997, the number of crashes has shown no consistent pattern. Fatal and injury crashes have also shown no consistent pattern since 1997. Belt usage (as a percentage) has increased from last year.

Alcohol-related Crash Information

There were no reported DWI arrests in 2004, 2005 or 2006. There is no DWI conviction data for Acoma Pueblo.

Crash Specifics

Crashes involving other vehicles were the most common class, accounting for 39 percent of all crashes. A crash involving an overturn resulted in a fatality. Semis were the vehicle type most often involved in crashes, accounting for 35 percent of all vehicles in crashes. Passenger cars accounted for 31 percent of vehicles involved in crashes. Together these two vehicle types comprised 62 percent of the vehicles involved in injury crashes. The two most common top contributing factors were excessive speed and driver inattention. There was one fatal crash in 2006. The top contributing factor for the fatal crash was alcohol involvement.

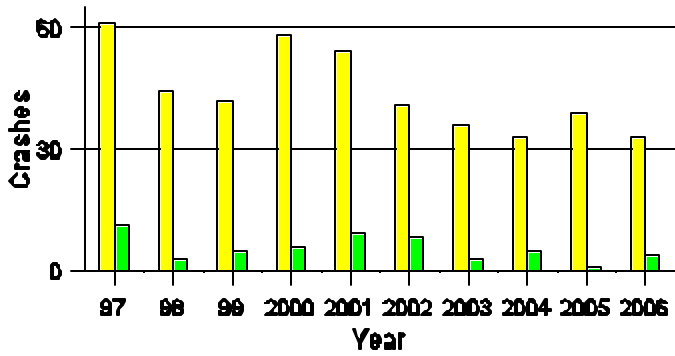
People in Crashes

Overall, males were 100 percent of drivers in crashes, although they account for only 46 percent of licensed drivers in Acoma Pueblo. There was one pedestrian involved in a crash. All three alcohol-involved drivers were male, one was between the ages of 50 and 54, and the other two were between the ages of 25 and 29. In 2006, no 'teenagers' or young adults were killed in crashes in Acoma Pueblo. Statewide 16 percent of alcohol-involved drivers were under 21; in Acoma Pueblo, no alcohol-involved drivers were under 21.

Note: The 1999 crash file contains 15% fewer crashes than the 1998 file. This may be due to problems implementing the new system after the old system failed, or to under reporting. Care should be used in interpreting differences between 1999 and other years in this report.

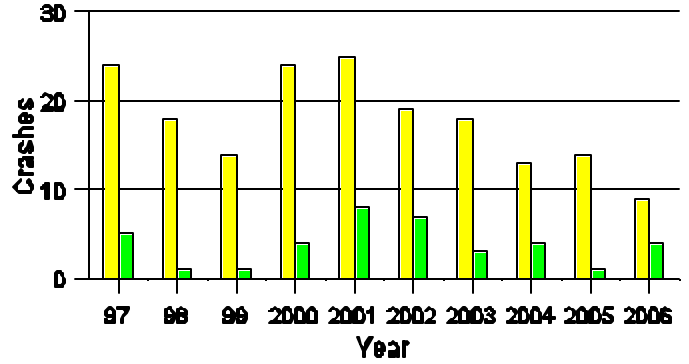

Fatal and Injury Crashes in Acoma Pueblo by Alcohol Involvement

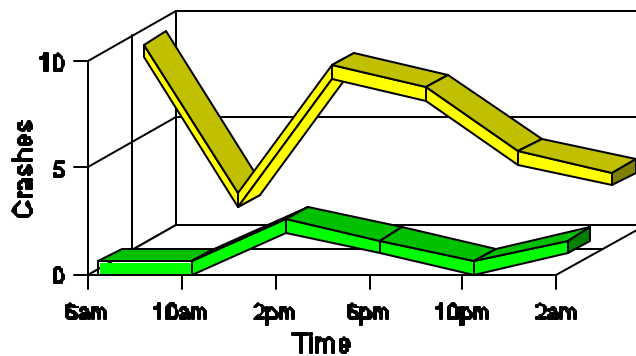

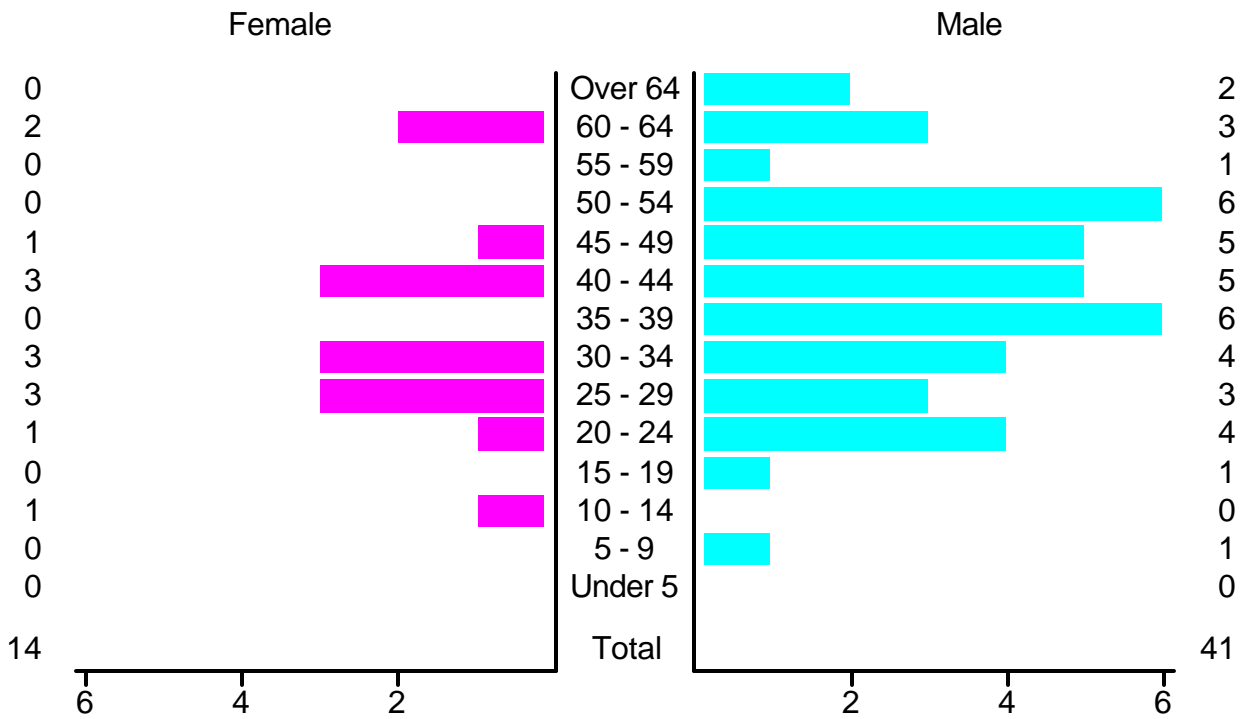

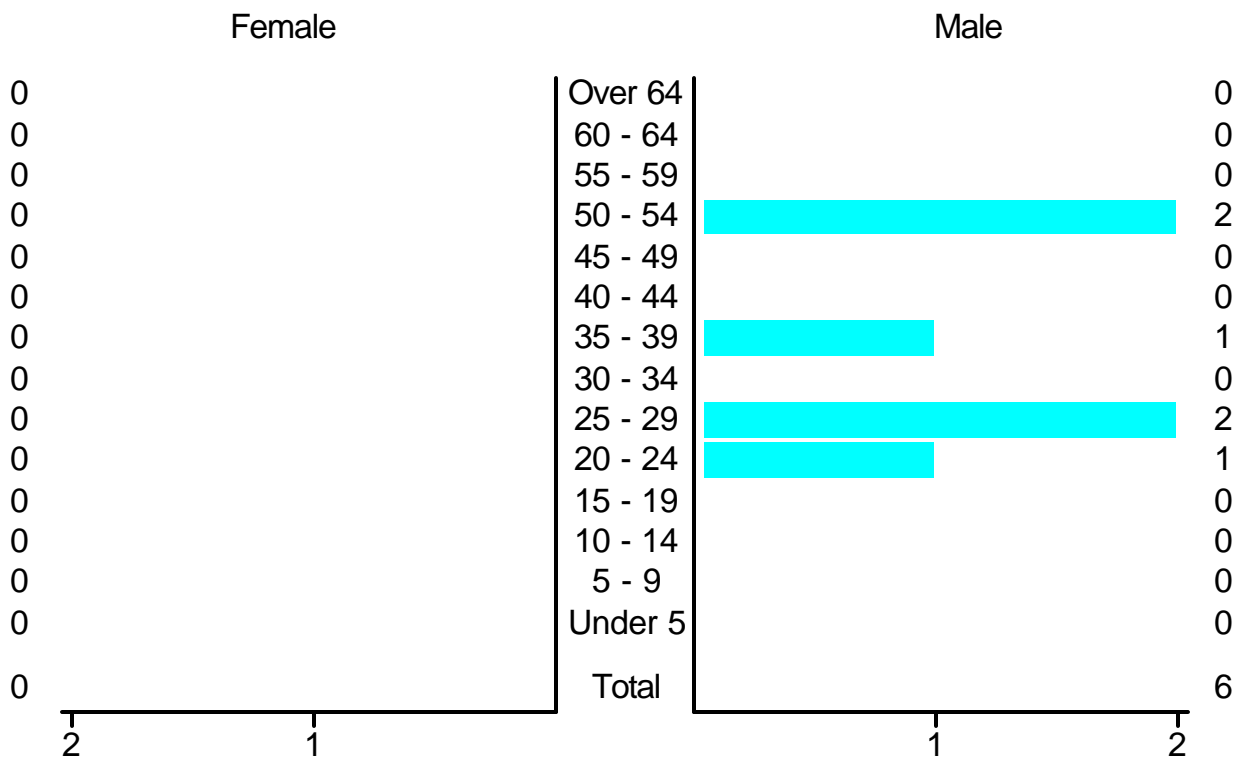

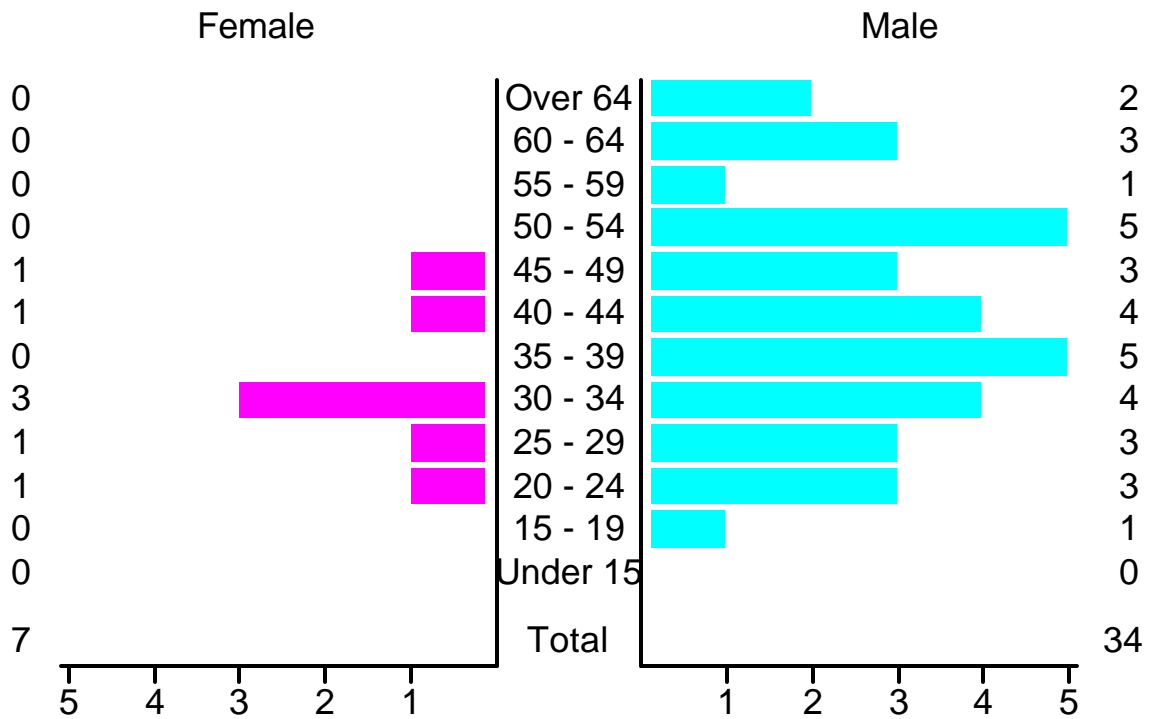
People in Crashes by Age and Sex in Acoma Pueblo, 2006



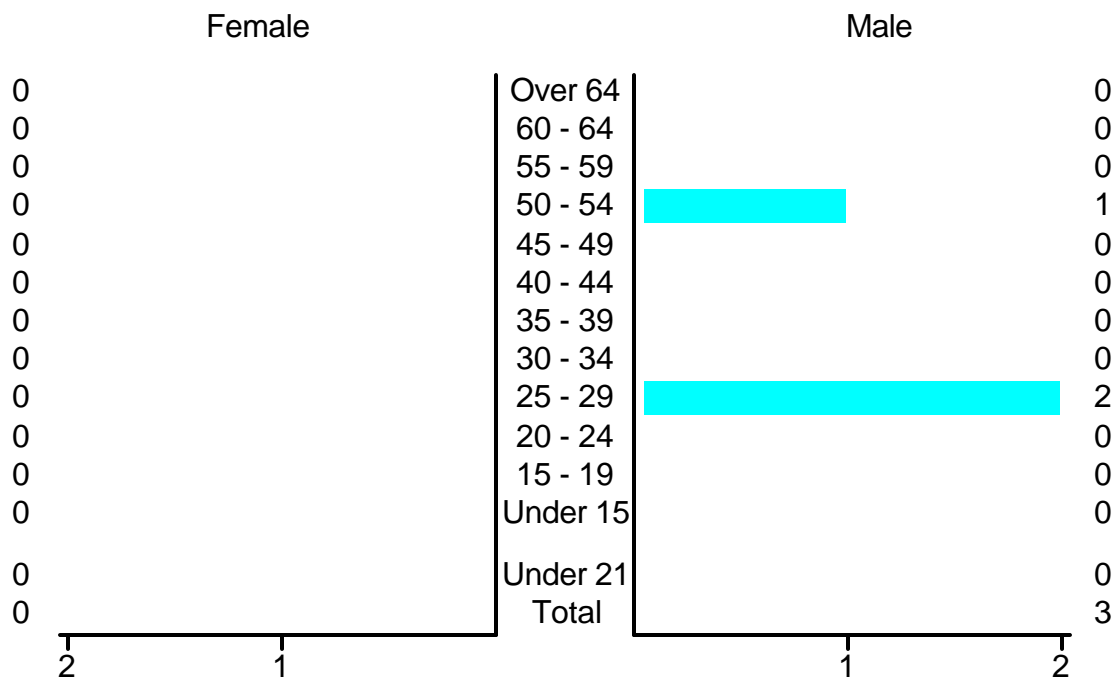
Drivers in Crashes by Age and Sex in Acoma Pueblo, 2006



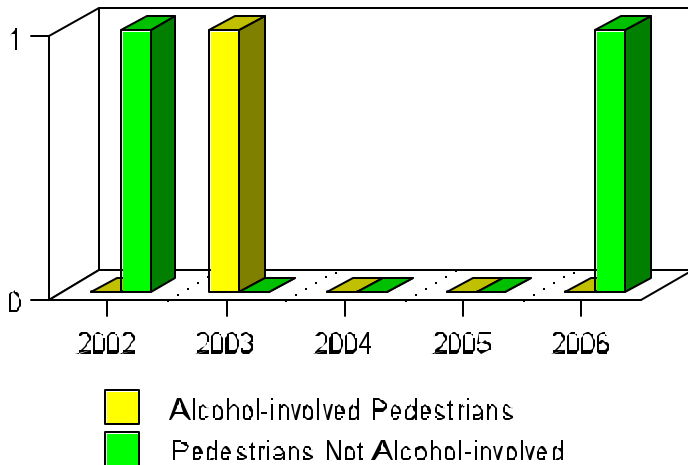
People in Alcohol-Involved Crashes in Acoma Pueblo, 2006
by Age and Sex



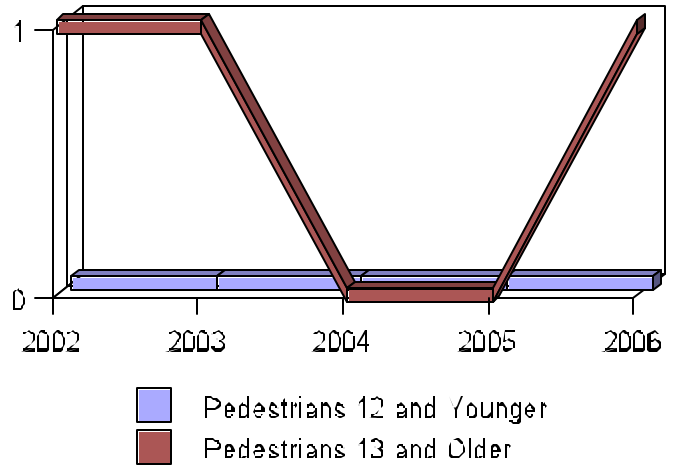
Drivers in Alcohol-Involved Crashes in Acoma Pueblo, 2006
