

# Transferring to The University of New Mexico (UNM) From Maricopa Community College District (MCCD)

Using the matrix of MCCD list of courses that can be used to satisfy the AGEC matrix as a guide, completion of the following areas listed below with MCCD courses will fulfill the UNM Core Curriculum requirements. The discipline areas represent UNM's Core Curriculum. The specific courses listed are offered within MCCD. In all cases, a minimum grade of "C" (not C-) is required.

**General Information**

The minimum requirements for transfer admission are 26 semester hours with a cumulative 2.00 gpa. Certain colleges and programs have higher eligibility guidelines. Students with fewer than 26 hours are considered transferring freshmen and must submit high school or GED transcript and ACT or SAT scores and meet freshman admission requirements as well.
