1.1 Overview

Keith Diaz Moore is an Associate Professor of Architecture and Chair of the Architecture Department in the School of Architecture, Design and Planning at the University of Kansas and is Associate Faculty of the Gerontology Center. In his role as chair, Professor Diaz Moore has facilitated his department in:

- Transitioning from a B.Arch. to M.Arch. professional degree
- Creating a Ph.D. in Architecture program
- Approving a study abroad requirement and expanding the number of study abroad options from 5 to 24 (including participation in the Glenn Murcutt studio at the University of New South Wales)
- enhancing interdisciplinary collaborations between Design, Architecture and Engineering
- Receiving grant support to infuse sustainability into the professional curriculum
- increasing diversity in our faculty profile with our recent hires
- encouraging our award-winning Studio 804 to address sustainability issues and thereby seeing the first LEED-platinum building in Kansas be built by our students
- increased both faculty grantsmanship and graduate enrollment twofold
- gaining distinguished professor recognition for Dan Rockhill

Dr. Diaz Moore's scholarly activities have focused on the nexus between culture and design, with a specialty in the area of environmental design for the elderly experiencing dementia. He has garnered over \$350,000 in external research grants and has been able to engage regional leaders in healthcare design into his studios, resulting in both economic and social capital gains. His leadership in this area has been recognized in his election and service as Chair of the Environmental Design Research Association (2006) and is currently Vice-President of the Architectural Research Center Consortium. Dr. Diaz Moore is also currently serving on the Board of Directors of AIA Kansas.
