Winning Interviews For Graduate School and Employment

- I. Strategies that will help you succeed in obtaining a great job or admission into graduate school
- II. The interview basics
 - A Be early; dress appropriately; smile, bring extra resumes
 - B. Be careful of fidgeting, tapping your foot, touching your face, nervous habits
- III. Research the prospective employer or graduate program
 - A. What do you know about the program or employer?
 - B. What do you know about the faculty/staff?
 - C. Is there anything unique about this employer/school?
- IV. Take a personal inventory: what are your strengths and weaknesses
 - A. Caution: Tooting your horn is important, but no one likes a braggart
 - B. How to handle your weaknesses
- V. Be prepared to answer: Where do you want to be in 5 years?
 - A. Don't be intimidated...be ready
 - B. Standard question #1: Tell me about yourself...the 'icebreaker' (career, strengths, examples)
 - C. Show enthusiasm, dedication and ambition through words and body language
- VI: Building rapport: project professionalism, self-confidence, relaxed energy, eye contact, facial gestures—practice talking in front of a mirror
 - A. Remember, it takes longer to undue a bad first impression than it does to make one!
 - B. Be a good listener (KEY TAKEAWAY)
- VII: A few good interview tips
 - A. Let interviewer finish question, control your biases, keep an open mind
 - B. Keep the interview on target, don't apologize
 - C. Focus on their needs (KEY TAKEAWAY)

KEY TAKEAWAYS: A great interview is like rock climbing; you only get better with practice.

Review and practice over all of the points discussed above for a very successful interview.

KEY TAKEAWAYS: How to say thank you. Tell the interviewer how much you enjoyed the meeting and express your enthusiasm for the company/school. Make any final 'selling points' and establish the next point of contact.
