

## **REPAIR POLICIES**

1. Only the University of New Mexico student, faculty and staff may have their bicycle serviced at the Bicycle Shop. Valid UNM identification required.
2. All prices do not include parts. If new parts are needed to complete the repair, you will be contacted prior to the installation to obtain your approval.
3. All prices are based on average repair time. If an excessive amount of time over the average is needed, additional charges may be assessed.
4. All work is guaranteed for 30 days.
5. All bicycles are repaired on a first come first served basis. Appointments may be made with the mechanic on duty.
6. All prices, policies and hours of operation are subject to change without notice.

Note: Many repairs may not be made unless the bicycle and/or parts have been thoroughly cleaned. A cleaning fee may be assessed by the mechanic on duty. Any cleaning fee will first be discussed with the customer.

## **BICYCLING AT UNM**

1. UNM, like most universities, has designed its on-campus facilities with pedestrians in mind. Bicyclists, like motorists must ride as not to endanger or impede pedestrian traffic. In all situations, pedestrians have the right away.
2. Bicycles are not to be locked or stored so as to block entrances or exists, obstruct wheelchair ramps or present a hazard to blind pedestrians. Bicycles so parked will be impounded.
3. Bicycles may be parked only at the bike racks.
4. Bicycles are a hazard in hallways and classrooms and are not permitted in University buildings, with the exception of residence halls.

Bicycles that are found to be in violation of Paragraph 2 to 4 will be impounded by the UNM Police and kept at the Campus Police office until claimed by the owner with proper identification for owner and bicycle. The UNM Police Department will not be held liable for damage to the securing devices such as chains and U-locks. In addition bicyclists are expected to obey state and city traffic regulations. Almost without exceptions, traffic codes in New Mexico apply equally to bicycles and motor vehicles.
