

THE REVEREND DR. SUZANNE H. EBEL

Dr. Ebel graduated in English Literature from UCLA in 1968, and received her Master's in Information Science and Administration from USC in 1970. She served on the faculty of the Webb School of California in Claremont for five years, before moving to the undergraduate library of the University of California, where she taught bibliographic instruction and shared the management of the library's reference and research services. In 1985 Suzanne was ordained as a Presbyterian Minister with an M.Div degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena. She has served churches in adult education ministry for over 25 years. During that time she completed the Doctor of Ministry degree with her thesis on the life and work of C. S. Lewis (*or I would say. . . her thesis on the apologetic work of C. S. Lewis*).

She holds the doctoral degree from Trinity Episcopal School for Ministry in Pittsburgh, PA. Suzanne is Associate Pastor at Sandia Presbyterian Church and an adjunct instructor in C. S. Lewis and American Church History at UNM. She has presented academic papers for C. S. Lewis conferences and has participated in numerous Lewis conferences internationally. She has served on the Board of the New Mexico Symphony Orchestra, sang for a number of years with Santa Fe's Sangre de Cristo Chorale, and currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Chamber Music Albuquerque organization. She is a member of the New Mexico Museum Foundation and the Spanish Colonial Arts Society.
