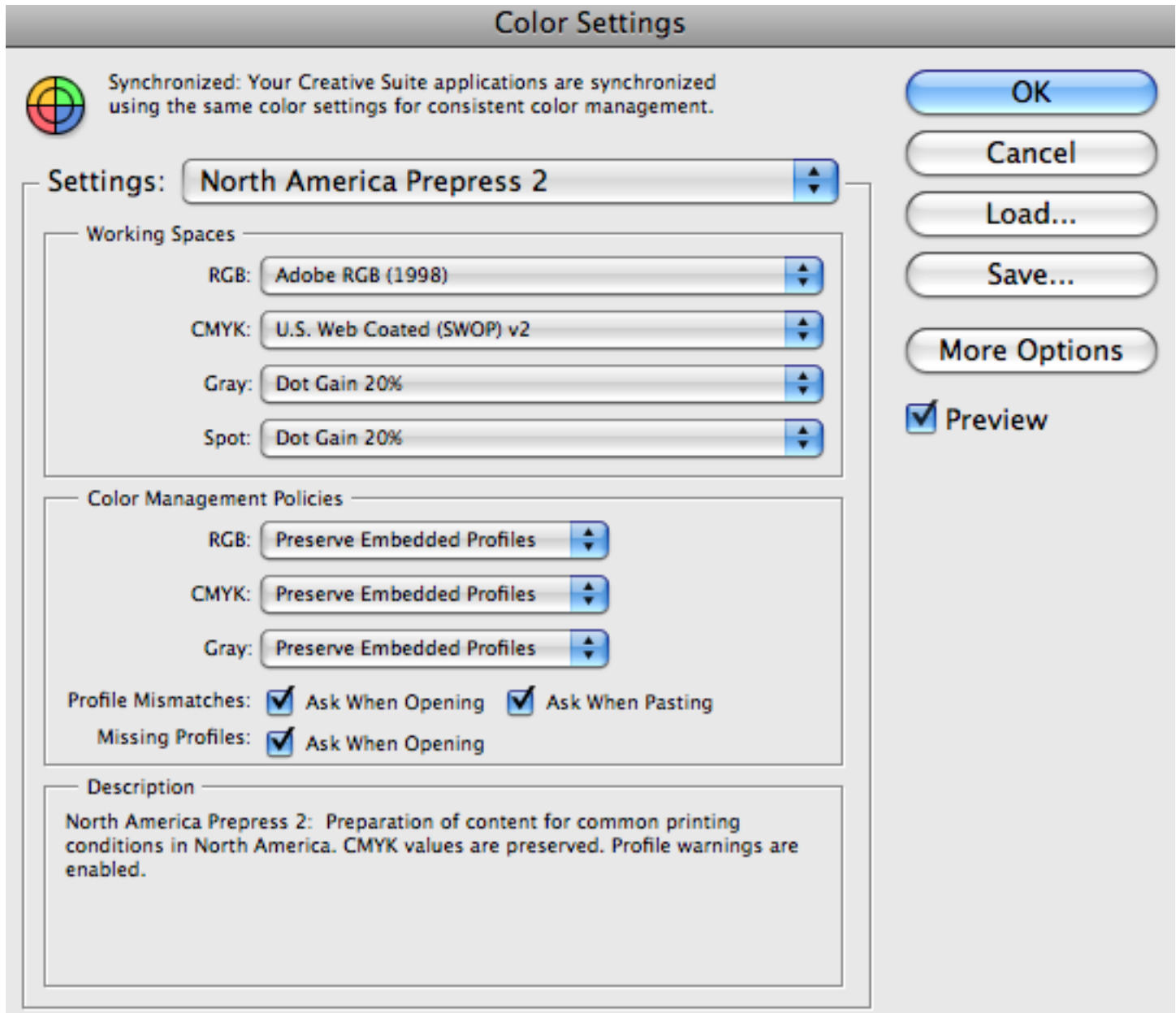


# Printing Color-Managed Photoshop Images on a Mac

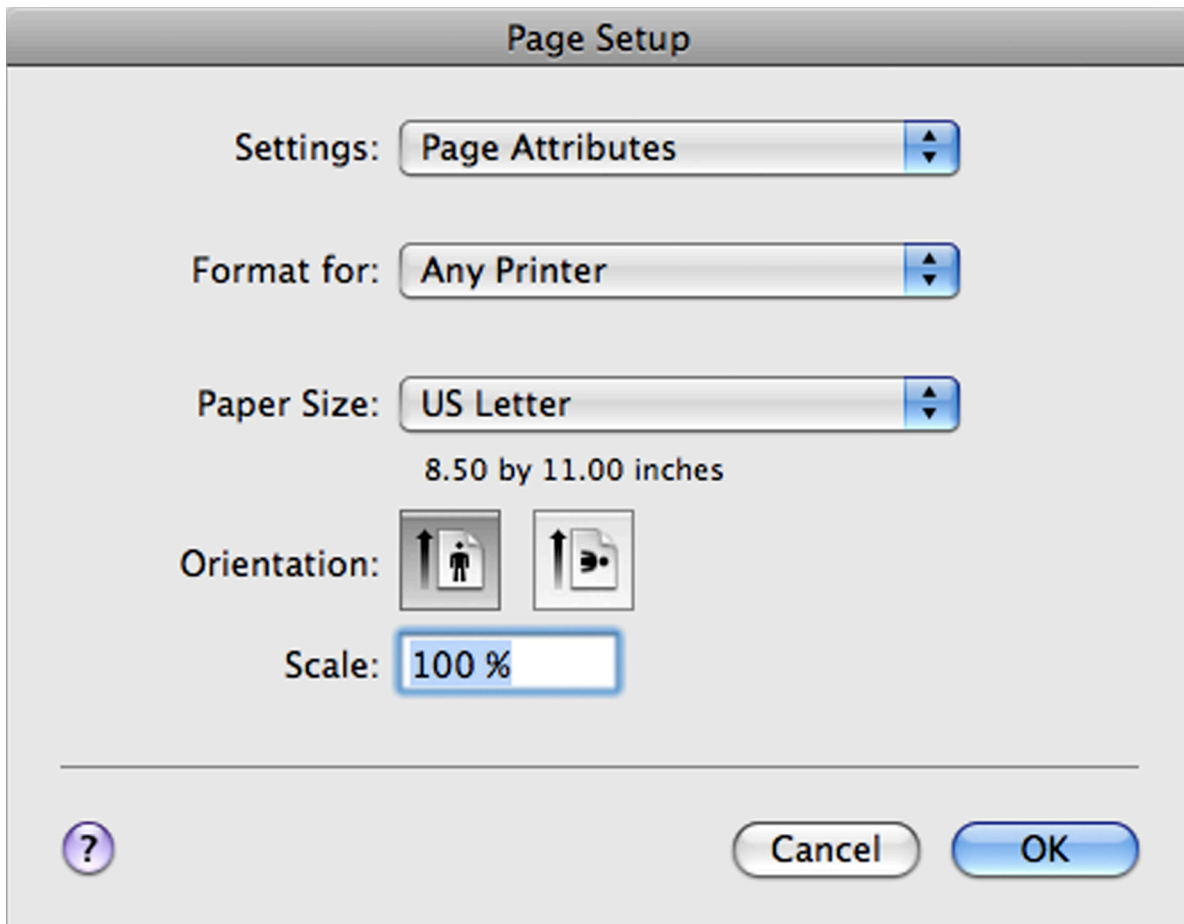
1. Start Photoshop
2. Choose Edit>Color Settings from the menu bar



3. Set “Settings” dropdown menu to “North America Prepress 2”
4. Click “OK” or press Return

5. Open the image from Adobe Bridge or Photoshop File>Open

6. Choose File>Page Setup in Photoshop



7. Use the dropdown “Format for” menu to choose your printer

8. Use the dropdown “Paper size” menu to choose your paper size

9. Use the “Orientation” icons to choose vertical or horizontal

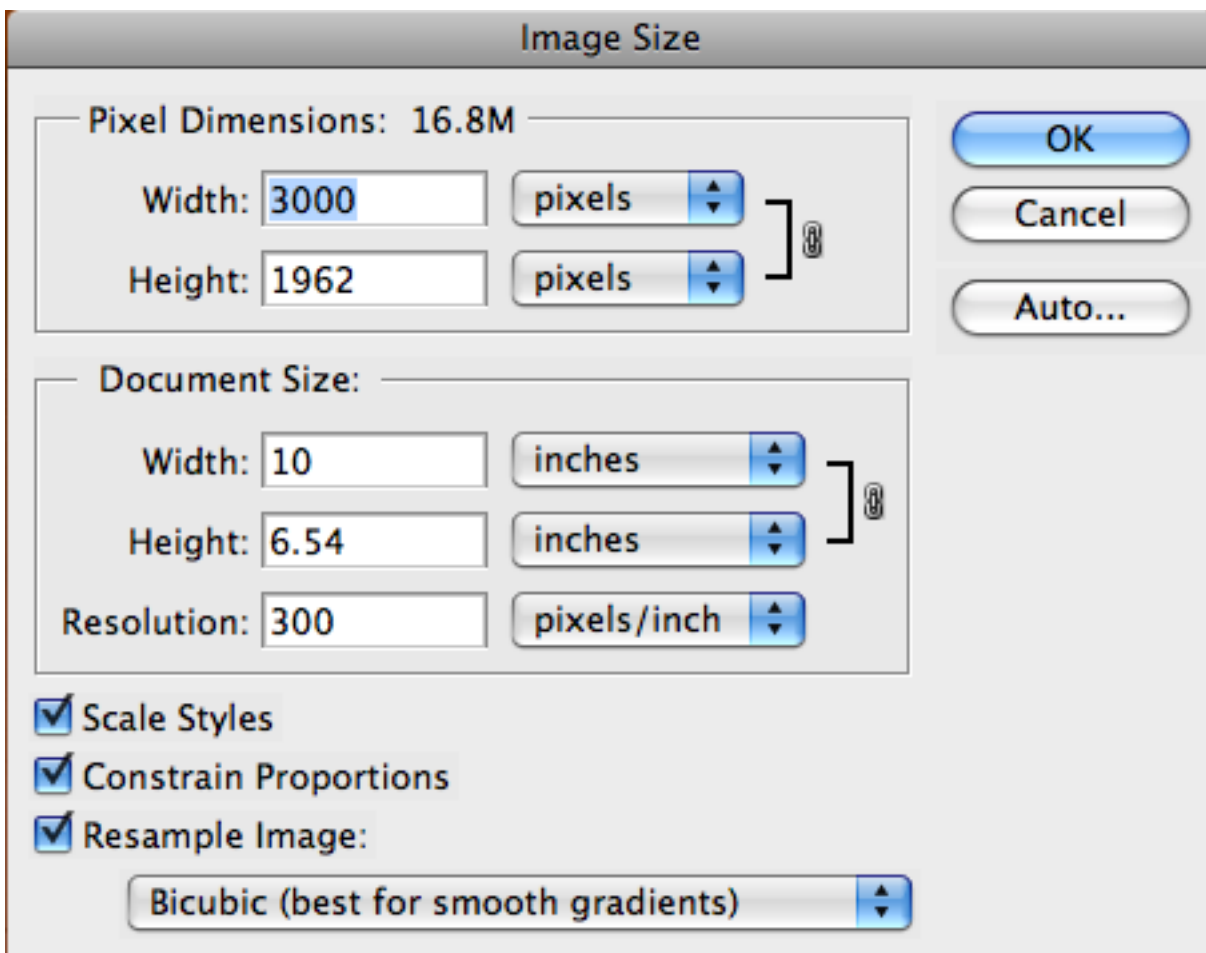
10. Click “OK” or press Return

11. Choose Image>Image Size

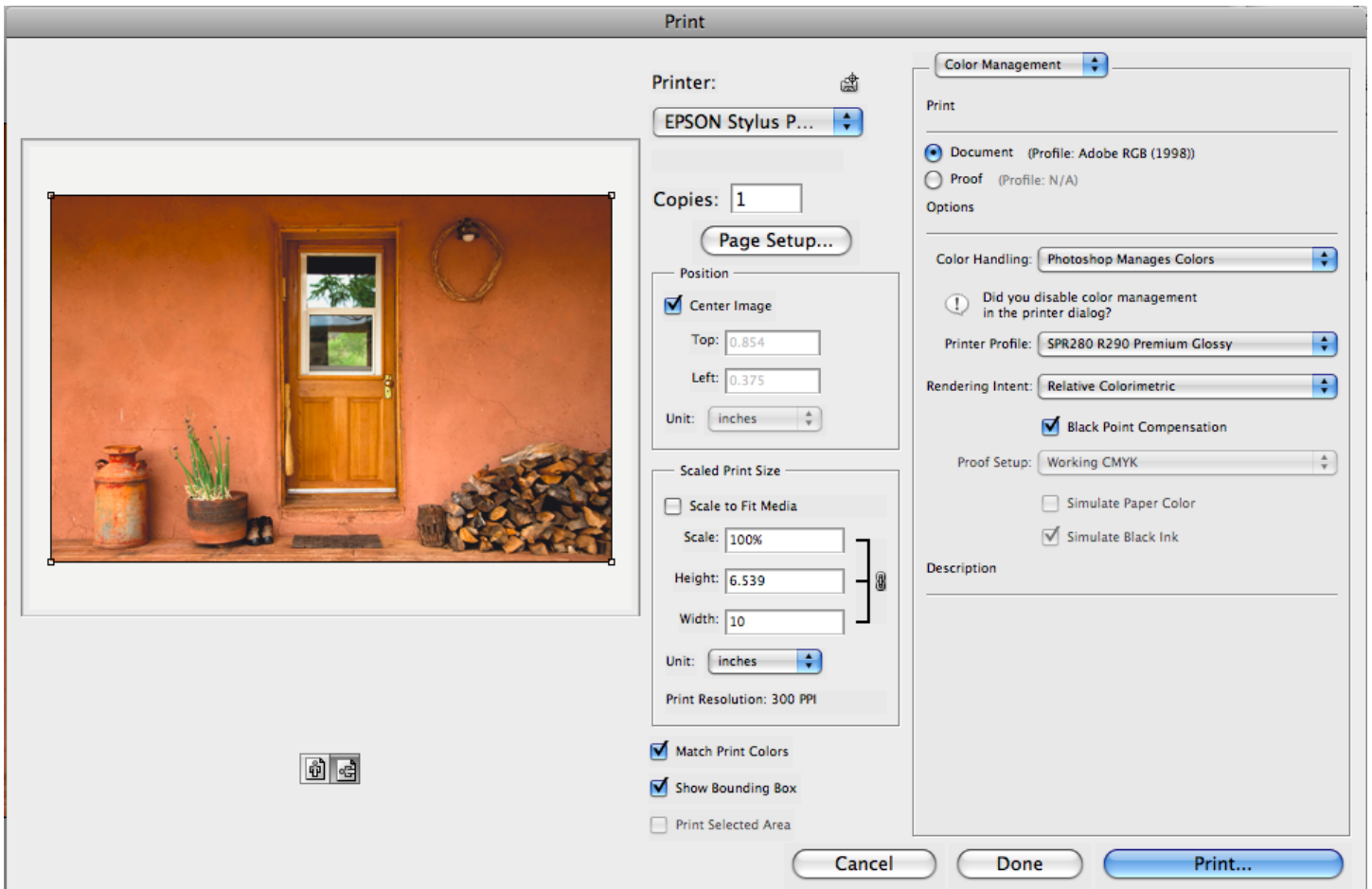
12. Change the size of the image so it will fit on the paper size

13. Change the Resolution to 300 ppi

14. Click on “OK” or press Return



14. Choose File>Print



15. Check to make sure your printer is still selected in “Printer”

16. Change “Color Handling” dropdown menu to

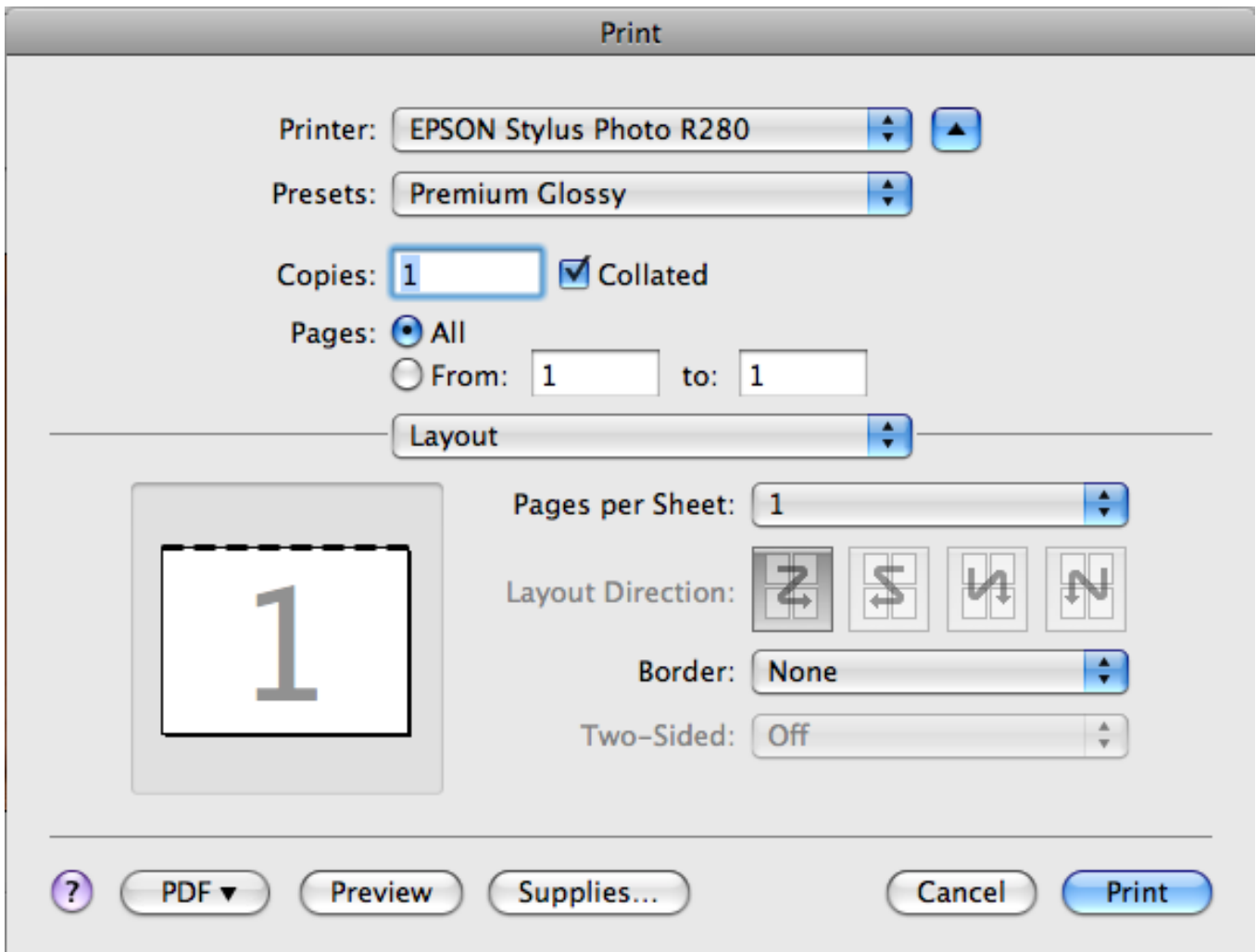
“Photoshop Manages Color”

17. Use “Printer Profile” dropdown menu to choose your printer paper profile

18. Set “Rendering Intent” to “Relative Colorimetric”

19. Make sure “Black Point Compensation” is checked

20. Click “Print” or press Return



21. Make sure your printer is still selected
22. Hold down on the “Layout” dropdown menu to select “Print Settings“
23. Choose your paper in the “Media Type” dropdown menu
24. Choose “Advanced” in the “Mode” dropdown menu
25. Choose “1440” in the “Print Quality” menu
26. Choose “Color Settings” from the “Print Settings menu
27. Click the “Off” radio button
28. Click on “Print” or press Return
