Undergraduate Course Offerings and Degree Requirements

These requirements are only one small portion of your undergraduate degree. You are responsible for meeting with an advisor in the College of Arts and Sciences regarding the University and College core requirements. It is in your best interest to verify that you are meeting degree requirements. This information is outlined in the University Catalog.

Students **must** earn a grade of **“C”** or higher in every Psychology course taken for their major or minor.

Students who declared their major or minor prior to Fall 1999 have the option of continuing under the catalog in effect when they entered the program. Please see the advisor for any substitutions or changes as a result of the curriculum changes.

Bachelor of Arts Degree

36 semester hours. 18 of these hours **MUST** be taken at UNM.

Psychology Minor

Psychology 105 plus 15 additional hours of Psychology (18 credits total). The Psychology Department does not specify a minimum number of upper division hours that are required for the minor. However, the College of Arts and Sciences recommends that the student take as many hours of upper division as possible so that you may meet the requirements for graduation.

¼ of all hours for the minor must be taken in residence at UNM

Bachelor of Science Degree

35 semester hours. 18 of these hours **MUST** be taken at UNM.

The BS Degree requires a minor in or distributed among Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics or Anthropology (Biological Anthropology or Human Evolutionary Ecology.)
