A parent objected to language used in the novel, including the word "nigger."
Because the book includes scenes depicting Egyptian worship rituals. "no student should be subjected to anything that has to do with evil gods or black magic."
The book's illustrations were offensive. The book is illustrated by Maurice Sendak.
Challenged as being "written by an atheist where the characters and text are anti-God, anti-Catholic, and anti-religion."
Requests to take the books out of school libraries, based on the claim they promote witchcraft.
Because the book exposes children to the occult.
Because of racial epithets.
Objections were raised because the book is about the scientific theory of evolution.
Two parents complained about profanity in the book.
Because it "promotes evolution" and that it was a too–graphic depiction of the slave trade.
Objections that the play is degrading to African Americans.
Because the image of a masked burglar pointing a gun at woman is too violent for young readers.
The book's use of the word "fart" and "farting" twenty-four times.
"Discussion of being drunk, smoking cigarettes, violence, 'dirty talk', reference to the Bible, and using God's name in vain." The novel went against the complainants' "religious beliefs."
