Quotations	Reproduction of creator's exact words.	Required . Format dependant on style manual. May be intext parenthetical citation, footnotes or endnotes.	Required. Visual materials	Pictures, charts, graphs, tables, maps, movies, other video .	Caption Figure (usually abbreviated Fig.), assigned an arabic numeral, and given a title or caption usually directly below the visual material. For photos of artwork, include the book's publication information of the text in which the image appears.	Required. Format dependant on style manual (Bibliography, Works Cited, etc).	Captions provide more information than the typical intext citation for text.
