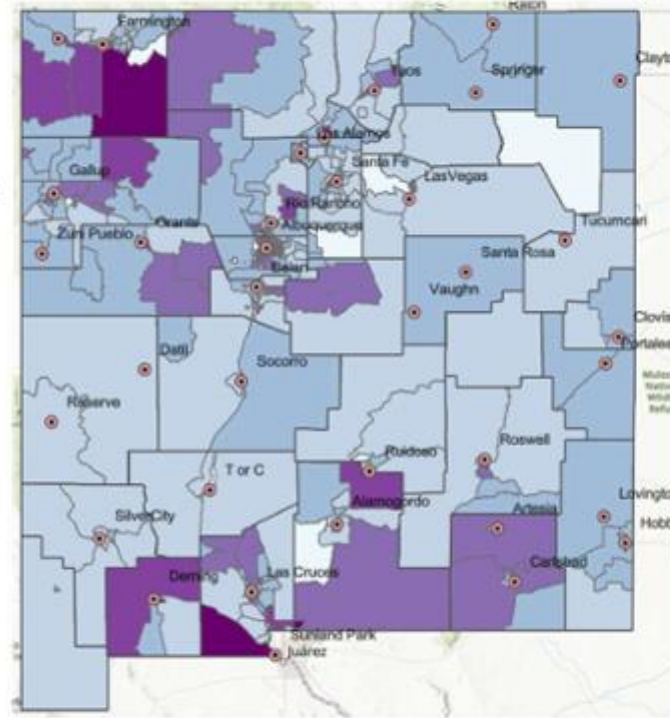
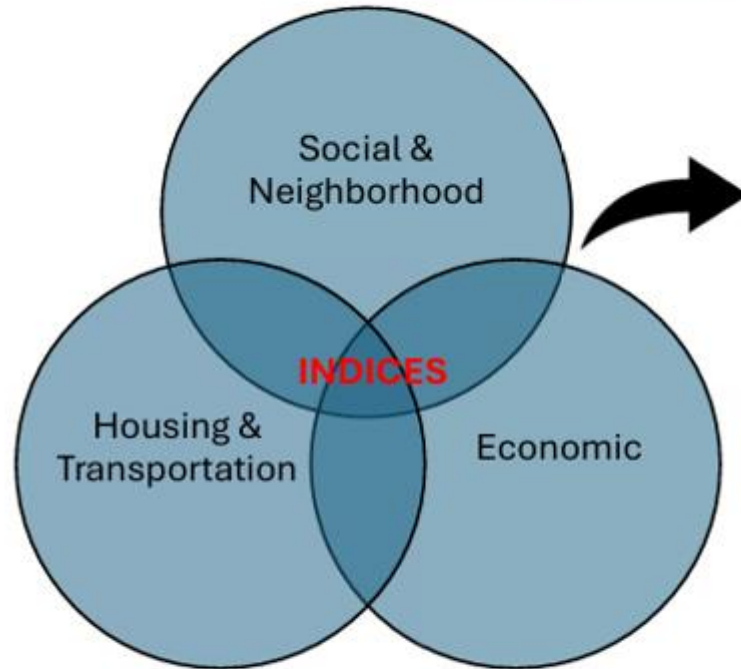


A New Mexico Test Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Index

- Education Access
- Neighborhood Environment
- Social & Community
- Health Care Access **

The first four categories are combined for this index. **This index can be used to statistically measure and evaluate health care access, the fifth category.

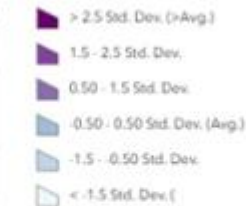

The map based on this test SDOH index shows that wide health disparities and inequalities are potentially present in New Mexico.

Note: A positive Z-score is greater than the New Mexico average (higher need). A negative Z-score is lower than the state average (lower need).
